ADVERTISING AND CALL FOR BIDS TO TRIM AND PRUNE

WHEREAS, the Monterey Cypress and Eucalyptus trees located at the Marina Equestrian Center are in need of trimming and pruning, and;

WHEREAS, the condition of the trees will continue to deteriorate and cause unsafe surroundings for the public, and;

WHEREAS, the trimming and pruning of the trees will improve the trees overall condition and improve the safety for those who use the nearby facilities and adjacent roadways, and;

WHEREAS, according to California Public Contract Code Section 20162, “When the expenditure required for a public project exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000), it shall be contracted for and let to the lowest responsible bidder after notice,” and;

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that the tree trimming and pruning will cost greater than five thousand dollars (\$5,000), and;

WHEREAS, California Labor Code Section 1771 requires that prevailing wages shall be paid to all workers employed on public works projects, including tree trimming and pruning when the work is performed under contract, and;

WHEREAS, there is no fiscal impact when calling for bids.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Marina does hereby authorize the advertising and call for bids to trim and prune trees located at the Marina Equestrian Center.

**REQUEST:**

It is requested that the City Council consider:

1. Adopting Resolution No. 2015-, authorizing advertising and call for bids to trim and prune trees at the Marina Equestrian Center.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Monterey Cypress and Eucalyptus trees located at the Marina Equestrian Center are in need of trimming and pruning. The condition of the trees will continue to deteriorate and cause unsafe surroundings for the public.

**ANALYSIS:**

The trimming and pruning of the trees will improve the trees overall condition and improve the safety for those who use nearby facilities and adjacent roadways.

According to California Public Contract Code Section 20162, "When the expenditure required for a public project exceeds five thousand dollars (\$5,000), it shall be contracted for and let to the lowest responsible bidder after notice." It is anticipated that the tree trimming and pruning will cost greater than five thousand dollars (\$5,000).

California Labor Code Section 1771 requires that prevailing wages shall be paid to all workers employed on public works projects (including tree trimming and pruning) when the work is performed under contract.


