

RESOLUTION NO. 2015-56

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARINA APPROVING ADVERTISING AND CALL FOR BIDS FOR THE 2015 ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECT, AND AUTHORIZING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO MAKE ALL NECESSARY ACCOUNTING AND BUDGETARY ENTRIES

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of December 18, 2012, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2012-196, approving an update to five (5) year City Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Included in the approved CIP project list was the Reservation Road – Seacrest to De Forest project and the Imjin Pkwy – 3rd Ave to Imjin Rd project, and;

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of October 1, 2013, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2013-140, receiving an informational presentation of the City’s Pavement Management Program. The Program Presentation included a list of critical arterial, collector and residential streets that require rehabilitation due to their low pavement condition index (PCI) score, and;

WHEREAS, at the regular meeting of February 26, 2014, the Transportation Agency for Monterey County (TAMC) adopted the Regional Surface Transportation Program 2014 (RSTP) Guidelines and Policies, along with allocation of RSTP funds to the City of Marina amounting to \$361,697 - \$100,000 for the Beach Road – SR1 to Marina Drive Project & \$261,697 for transportation projects, and;

WHEREAS, the Project consists of roadway maintenance on Reservation Road – Seacrest Ave. to Crescent Ave., Imjin Parkway – Imjin Rd. to 2nd Ave., Vaughan Ave. – Hillcrest to Reindollar, and Reindollar Ave. – Vaughan Ave. to Ellen Ct. All roadway maintenance, except for Imjin Pkwy., will consist of overlaying the roadway with asphalt concrete, raising valves and utility boxes to grade, and pavement striping and markings. The maintenance scope for Imjin Pkwy. will consist of a slurry seal with pavement striping and markings, and;

WHEREAS, in order to adequately finance the project, various funds will be utilized. Project funds of \$456,450 have been allocated for the Reservation Road and Imjin Parkway projects through City Council Resolution No. 2012-196. Fair-share funds amounting to \$261,697 from the 2014 TAMC RSTP allocation will also be applied to the Project. Staff requests additional funds to be allocated from the FY 14/15 Gas Tax Pavement Maintenance and Construction Account No. 22.223.65896 in the amount of \$95,000 to the Reservation Road CIP Project Account No. 62.309, and;

WHEREAS, the design has been completed and project is ready for advertisement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Marina does hereby approve advertising and call for bids for the 2015 Roadway Resurfacing Project.

RECOMMENDATION TO CONSIDER ADOPTING RESOLUTION NO. 2015-, APPROVING ADVERTISING AND CALL FOR BIDS FOR THE 2015 ROADWAY RESURFACING PROJECT, AND AUTHORIZING THE FINANCE DIRECTOR TO MAKE ALL NECESSARY ACCOUNTING AND BUDGETARY ENTRIES

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council:

1. Consider adopting Resolution No. 2015-, approving advertising and call for bids for the 2015 Roadway Resurfacing Project, and;
2. Authorizing the Finance Director to make all necessary accounting and budgetary entries.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact to calling for bids. However, should the City Council approve this request, adequate funding will be contained in City Capital Projects Fund Account No. 62.308 and 62.309.
