The Marina Youth Center is a drop in program located at the Rocky Han Community Center, 211 Hillcrest Avenue in Marina, Ca. Which provides children ages 5 - 12 (grades K-6) Monday through Friday from 2:00 P.M. to 6:00 P.M., with an early open on Wednesday's at 1:00 P.M. During school breaks and Holidays hours may vary, please check ahead of time.

The Youth Center offers a "Rec Room" with pool tables, air hockey, video games, and other activities including the Marina "Indoor Stadium;" and the Rocky Han Youth Computer Lab. On any given school day the Youth Center sees an average of 80 children; during school breaks the Youth Center's attendance increases to an average of 100 children per day.

Currently we are already into what is promising to be a fantastic year for the Youth Center! Last year's 'Marina at Play' partnerships funds went towards updating, improving, and adding more programs for youth.

The Marina Teen Center



The Marina Teen Center, opened in 2009, providing a safe structured environment for teens after school and during breaks and holidays to stay active and out of trouble.

The purpose of Marina's Teen Center is to provide a safe supervised environment for teens to relax, do homework, receive nutritional snacks, and enjoy various games and activities. The 3,200 square foot teen center building houses 14 multi-use computers, six 42" LCD televisions, six video games systems, and a 360-degree video surveillance system. The center's main attractions are the 2 pool tables, Foosball and air-hockey tables that fill the front room. Weekly field trips consist of bowling, movies, and ice skating. Then major events like Halloween and New Years Eve, teens get to enjoy great barbeque, dance contests, and various fun attractions.

On the Outside of the teen center, there is a barbecue area, full size basketball court and picnics tables. The teens really created their own play areas with the life size chess board serving as a break-dancing pad and a chess playing area. Twice a week, the break dancers have a dedicated area inside to showcase their skills for everyone! In 2013 the teens really enjoyed the basketball court as it also was not only used to play basketball, but football, and dodge-ball. These outside courts are home to many various games and leagues, where teens compete for prizes and bragging rights.

The Skate Park is also located on the outside of the Teen Center facility, where youth have participated in State and National competitions, as well as help host local monthly skate jams that have taken place at our Skate Park. The City Skate park program gives a professional image of skate boarding. The program is viewed positively by the younger children, and provides another quality recreation opportunities to the city. The local skate Jams attracts skaters from all over the state.

Teen Center Breakfast Club

Before the sunrises in the City of Marina, staff and volunteers are busy preparing breakfast for the Breakfast Club Program.

The Breakfast Club is a teen program where middle school and high school students have the opportunity to come, relax, enjoy some food, and do homework before school starts. Providing a healthy breakfast and a place for children to be, when it is too early to be allowed onto campus. This help teens start the day well, ensuring a morning meal allowing them to better concentrate in the classroom. There is no income qualifications, and is open to all Middle & High School students. The program has been running since 2008 and currently has an average of 180 students per morning. 
Teen Center After School Snack Program



The After School Snack Program, located at the Marina is designed to serve students with a healthy snack at school days. Students must be a Teen Center member in order to participate, ensuring there are sufficient daily quantities available. An average of 80 students per day receive after-school snacks which

consist of various healthy foods. Currently, Wal-Mart is assisting staff with the menu and providing the snacks on a weekly basis. This program was made possible, thanks to a grant from the Community Foundation for Monterey County of \$5,000 and a grant from the Wal-Mart Foundation of \$1,500 and numerous weekly food donations. Wal-Mart has also donated kitchen appliances and cookware to facilitate this project. In order for the continued success of this program donations are being accepted by The Marina Foundation on behalf of the After School Snack Program.





Senior Program

The Marina Senior Center is open Monday - Friday from 9:30 AM until 2:00 PM Wednesday 9:00- 1:00 PM, (11:00 - 1:00 during winter break of produce market) located at The Rocky Han Community Center at 211 Hillcrest Avenue. Offering various regular programmed activities, events, and field trips for community members ages 55 and up. In an effort to help keep our seniors active and healthy the Marina Recreation & Cultural Services Department offers a variety of exercise classes, dance classes, and other activities that stimulate both mind and body.

Line Dancing: The City of Marina Rocky Han Community Center is hopping with our line dancers, Led by Silvia Texeria & George Mills. Join them to begin learning or polish up your line dancing moves. This is a popular dance trend with our seniors and a great fitness opportunity. Monday & Wednesdays So get moving!



Weekly Produce Market: Spring, Summer, Fall. The Senior Produce Market sell fresh fruits and vegetables, eggs and cheese at wholesale prices to seniors most of whom are on fixed incomes. Volunteers and elders gather to share conversation, a small buffet lunch or to celebrate birthdays or holidays. Perishable leftover produce from the market is donated to another non-profit organization that serves seniors and others in need. The Marina Senior Program Produce Market donates its perishable leftovers.



Among the reasons Marina was selected as a 100 Best Community is because we support our youth in many ways like: building a new teen center in 2009 from which we serve the Breakfast Club every school day before school opens and establishing the Friday Night Live youth development program; establishing a Recreation Department in 2006 to make recreation a priority in our city; establishing junior high, senior high, and skate park advisory boards with youth; establishing a city skate team which recently won the 2011

State Games of America National Junior Olympic Skateboarding Championship; our three primary service clubs, Rotary, Kiwanis, and Lions each have programs to support our local youth development; and we have some specialized youth arts development programs like Marina Youth Arts and Spector Dance to name a few of the reasons.

More than 7,000 students drop out of a U.S. school every day, equal to 1.3 million young people a year. This means about one out of every four students do not graduate high school, making the dropout crisis a critical issue for our communities and nation.

America's Promise Alliance raises awareness and supports communities to ensure that young people have the fundamental resources needed to graduate high school and succeed in college, work and life.
